BOARD UPDATE

Looking back on 2022, many projects were completed to improve and maintain the community. Below are some highlights, and we hope that

completion of these projects aided in your enjoyment of the community.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS

- Tree maintenance/pruning in March and December address the highest level priority tree work needed within the community.
- In summer, the Limelight Newsletter went digital.
- National Night Out cookout in August brought neighbors together.
- Invasive plant treatment continued in four areas in the community.
- Turf remediation was completed for several areas in October.
- In November, the tennis courts were resurfaced with one court being converted to a multi-sport court.
- Also in November, invasive bamboo was removed near Churchman Court.
- 28 new trees were planted in December.
- An updated reserve study was completed.

LOOKING TO 2023

- On January 5, members of the board accepted the 2022 Friends of Trees Award that was awarded to our community.
- A review of the reserve study will be conducted in order to help guide community projects for the next few years.
- The board will continue to work with the community to roll out a more robust communication vehicle for the community to share information.

DON'T FEED THE WILD THINGS

While it is common to see deer and other wildlife roaming around our Loft Ridge homes, feeding them can be illegal and often has unintended negative consequences which do more harm than good. Officials recommend against feeding wildlife in general, as it can cause humanwildlife conflicts that too often result in poor outcomes for wildlife. Furthermore, it's



against the law in Fairfax County to feed deer all year round (due to Chronic Wasting Disease). Instead, plant native plants that provide food and habitats.

MISSED THE CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP?

If you missed the natural Christmas collection for recycling (Jan 2-13), please do NOT dispose of the trees in the woods. Schedule a **brush Special Pickup** to have the Christmas tree removed. Lights, decorations and stands should be removed to ensure collection.

SPECIAL PICK-UPS

Make sure you call 703-802-3322 or schedule **online** by Tuesday 2pm. Before you add to an existing pile, ensure pick-up has been scheduled. The material scheduled must be out by 6pm on Tuesday placed away from trees and trash/ recycle cans.

DON'T GET STUCK: INCLEMENT WEATHER TOWING

A friendly reminder that the Association may authorize the immediate removal of vehicles on LRHOA roadways and parking areas that are stalled, stuck, parked or abandoned and may authorize storage of removed vehicles. Homeowners are subject to the imposition of charges for removal and storage of these vehicles.

ROSE HILL SHOPPING CENTER UPDATE: NEARBY RHCA CONTINUES OPPOSITION TO REDEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL

The Rose Hill Civic Association recently conducted a residential survey of the proposal by Combined Properties, longtime owner of the Rose Hill Shopping Center, to redevelop the plaza. According to the RHCA's latest newsletter, The Rambler, the survey found a large percentage of respondents are concerned about increased traffic and higher population density, though many residents expressed support for upgrades to the property and a desire to preserve a shopping center that is compatible with the surrounding neighborhood. "The Board of Supervisors has accepted Combined Properties' plan for redevelopment as part of the Site Specific Plan Amendment process, so the issue moves into the public arena. The County has announced, as part of an electronic news release, that the SSPA nomination for the Rose Hill Shopping Center will be discussed at a meeting on Monday, January 23, in the cafeteria of the Franconia Elementary School at 7 p.m. At the January meeting, the RHCA will continue its opposition," reported Carl Sell, RHCA President to Loftridge Communications Chair, Mindy Mizell. "We object to 400 apartments and up to six story buildings on the site because it will disrupt traffic and further overcrowd our schools. We appreciate the support of our neighbors. We would support an upgrade of the center, but not at the density the owners are seeking." The full article can be found here.
