

It's That Time of Year! Architectural Inspections Are Underway

Exterior inspections allow our Loft Ridge neighborhood to maintain its community standards and property value year over year to attract new residents and keep existing homeowners.

Starting in late April/early May, Sequoia Management Company will conduct annual inspections of every home within the Loft Ridge community. Once these inspections are finalized, letters will be mailed to all homeowners in violation. Please take the time to familiarize yourself with the Architectural Control Committee (ACC) Guidelines and other Rules and Regulations and correct any issues with your home that may violate the Guidelines.

Additionally, if you plan to sell your home this year, it is highly recommended that homeowners check in with management to determine what approvals you have for architectural modification to your home. This will help avoid any missing applications prior to the resale/disclosure process to ensure a smooth transition.

Join the ACC Committee

Did you know our governing documents require an Architectural Control Committee (ACC), comprised of a minimum of three volunteer homeowners? The Committee's primary responsibilities are to review and disapprove all requests submitted for exterior changes and to ensure the Architectural Guidelines are followed.

Public Hearing: 4-cent Real Estate Tax Hike?

The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors has advanced a proposal for a 4-cent real estate tax increase, which would mark the first hike in six years, if approved.

A public hearing will be held in the board auditorium at the Fairfax County Government Center (12000 Government Center Parkway) over three days, starting Tuesday, April 16. <u>Learn more.</u>

Itching to Get Those Spring Cleaning Wheels in Motion?

As Fairfax County Collection Customers, you can take advantage of their services beyond trash and recycling.

The county offers five (5) FREE special/bulk pickups per customer, per fiscal year (July 1-June 30). This means that five times a year the county will haul off 2 cubic yards (about 6 ft x 3 ft x 3ft) of waste for you without you ever needing to load up your car. This includes things like refrigerators, small tree limbs, mattresses, wood pallets, TVs, grills, exercise equipment, etc. I myself have used it in order to dispose of a mattress and table. While they won't come for a pickup without you first scheduling one, it is super easy and I think we are incredibly lucky to be able to have a service like this. Now with any super exciting service, there are rules, limits, and procedures so please carefully read through the Fairfax County Bulk Pickup Page before scheduling your first pickup.

Does that spring cleaning itchiness lead you outside? Fortunately Fairfax County's yard waste pickup has started again for the year! Just place your leaves, grass, shrub, and tree trimmings in compostable paper bags (I get mine from our local bulk-sale club) and place them out on the curb with your trash and recycling bins. There are limits on what they will take, however, so make sure you place any invasive vegetation (English Ivy, Kudzu, click to see more) in the regular trash and steer away from soil, stumps, large branches, etc, too. The Fairfax County Yard Waste Pickup Page has more information on how to dispose of yard waste with the county.

Has your itch not been scratched because of a missed pickup? Fairfax County offers email updates and provides a signup here. If you're looking for a more case-by-case update, call 703-802-3322 or fill out a form here. Fairfax County asks you to wait until late in the day to report a missed collection but before 4:30pm the following business day.

Please remember that in Loft Ridge trash and recycling isn't to be put out until 5:00pm Monday night and containers need to be put away as soon as possible on the following Tuesday. Between these times trash and recycling containers cannot be on common grounds and must be within your rear yard. We understand that missed pickups interfere with this schedule, but it doesn't prevent you from bringing your cans back when they're finally empty. Hopefully you're itching to be respectful of your neighbors, too.

Billions Of Cicadas to Emerge in VA in Rare 2024 Double-breed Event

For the first time in 221 years, two broods of cicadas are set to make an unprecedented emergence this summer in Maryland and Virginia – but not in the DC region. Brood XIII, which comes out every 17 years, and Brood XIX, which emerges every 13 years are set to emerge simultaneously in a rare, synchronized event that last occurred in 1803. And while cicadas used to emerge in mid-May, this year they are due to arrive in April. In Virginia, residents will likely see them in parts of Caroline and King George County, as no cicadas are expected to emerge in the immediate Washington, DC area. Learn more.
