Warmest Greetings of the Season

Christmas Tree Pickup

trees will be picked up with the trash **ONLY** January 3 and 10. Please do **NOT** dispose of the trees in the woods.



Snow Plowing & Sand

Snow plowing will occur at 3" and sand will be spread as needed.

Keep It Cleared

Don't block the mailbox area with your garbage/recycle cans.

Wet Shoes?

Board News

Management, grounds maintenance and snow plowing and sanding contracts were renewed. Minimal tree work was done. Irrigation systems were winterized.

Aeration, overseeding and **mulching** were done in October. November saw the first **leaf removal**, second is scheduled for December. The **audit** was completed with no issues.

Fly? Need New Driver's License

In 2018, Virginia will begin to comply with the Real ID Act designed to help prevent terrorist attacks and reduce the number of licenses granted to undocumented immigrants. Beginning in Fall of 2020, the only driver's licenses that will be accepted for purposes such as boarding commercial flights, will be those that meet the Real ID Requirements.

But beginning **January 20, 2018** TSA agents will begin enforcing the air travel provision at security checkpoints, accepting licenses only from compliant states or those that have been granted extensions (**like Virginia** until **October 2018**).

The Real ID card will have a one-time \$10 fee that will help pay for implementation. To obtain one, current license holders will be required to present two proofs of residency, and will have to present their **Social Security Card** instead of just proving the number. The process will require an **in-person visit to a DMV office.**

2017 Bluebird Box Wrap-Up

Our 5th season of monitoring bluebird nest boxes as part of the Virginia Bluebird Trail has come to a close. Early in the season, we added 2 final nest boxes to our trail in the field across from the Ridge View Drive tot lot, a location known to have attracted bluebirds in the past. These new boxes netted our first successful bluebird nest since 2013 – 4 bluebird babies were raised! Across Loft Ridge's nine total boxes, the native House Wren continues to dominate the nests with 17 total babies raised this year. Because House Wrens compete aggressively with Eastern Bluebirds for these boxes (i.e. throwing bluebird eggs out of the nest), we will be considering ways to minimize wren disturbance in 2018 to help give bluebirds the best chance for nesting success.

Clean-Up Station Installed

The cleanup station mentioned in last issue has been installed next to the tennis courts. Please

Fox With Mange Rabid?

A fox with mange has been seen throughout Loft Ridge in daytime and at night. Following is from the Animal Control website.

Fox are indigenous to Northern Virginia and have adjusted to being suburban wildlife. They have a higher chance of carrying mange than most other wildlife and they will scratch until their coat is almost completely gone. This is not a pretty sight, but common. They are not a threat to citizens unless cornered and feel they need to defend themselves or their pups. Fox are also opportunist and scavengers, and will search for food during the day or night. We recommend that if a resident sees a fox, he or she should simply leave the animal alone.

Vietnam Memorial 35th Anniversary

This Memorial was dedicated November 13, 1982 to honor service members who fought and died in the Vietnam War or are missing in action (MIA). As part of a 2-acre complex, the *Memorial Wall* is comprised of two 246'9" gabbro panels and 140 black granite panels displaying 58,318 engraved names. Approximately 3 million visitors view this annually many of whom perform "rubbing" by placing a piece of paper over a name on the wall and rubbing a pencil over it as a memento of their loved one.

The *Three Servicemen* is a bronze statue purposely identified as European American, African American and Hispanic American. *In Memory* plaque was added in November 2004 to honor veterans who died after the war as a direct result of injuries suffered in Vietnam.

The *Women's Memorial* is dedicated to the women who served in the Vietnam War, most of whom were nurses. It depicts three uniformed women with a wounded soldier.

Last Winter's Weather

January

- 7th temperature of 73 broke record from 2012
- 8th temperature of 74 was highest since records have been kept
- 30th we saw our 1st inch of snow (2013 1st inch arrived March 21)
- 19 straight days of 32 degrees+ surpassing an 1872 record

February was warmest since record-keeping started in 1871, record previously held in 1976. And, no surprise, it had the meteorological distinction for being dry - - only a trace of snow fell.

2017-2018 Weather Predictions

NOAA and local weather channels predict a



warmer than normal winter with less than average snowfall (maybe 10-19" total). Early January could be colder and maybe deliver a snowstorm.

Farmer's Almanac has Virginia in the wintry chill, wet and white zone. It is red-flagging January 20-23, February 4-7 and 16-19, March 1-3 and 20-23 for heavy precipitation along the Atlantic seaboard. If that turns out to be true, better have your snow shovel and salt-free ice melt or non-clumping kitty litter handy.

? Rain = Inch of Snow?

In the U.S. on average, an inch of rain produces about 13 inches of snow. But the actual ratio depends on the wetness of the snowfall. An inch of rain may result in only six inches of heavy, wet snow - - the hard to shovel stuff that kids delight in for snowmen. Or you can get three feet of the dry, powdery kind that won't hold together for snowballs but skiers and snowboarders like it and so do kids since school usually closes.

And When It Snows

You are responsible for shoveling your porch/stoop, walkway and the sidewalk in front of your home as well as your numbered parking space. Shoveling snow from an unnumbered space doesn't mean you staked a claim but common courtesy is if you didn't clear the space, don't park in it.

Winter Hydration

In the summer, it's easy to remember to drink plenty of liquids but it's also important in winter. Drinking water can give your immune system a boost and help prevent you from getting sick during cold and flu season. Signs of dehydration can be headaches, dizziness, drowsiness, muscle cramping, nausea and vomiting. In the wintertime especially you may notice dry skin, chapped lips and a dry mouth.

Winter Tidbits

- When removing snow from shrubs, use a broom and sweep in an upward motion to avoid breaking branches.
- Spraying your shovel with cooking spray will ensure snow won't stick to it.
- Gently rub a small, moistened cloth bag of iodized salt on the outside of windshield to prevent ice and snow from sticking.
- Stuck on ice without sand or kitty litter? Use your car mats to get traction.
- Have hanging icicles? Tap them with a broom, from a window if possible.

Shoveling Courtesy

Don't throw snow into the street or push it in front of islands. It will freeze, turn to ice and when the plow returns, the snow will end up behind vehicles again.

Ensure the mailman can get safely to the mailboxes, storm drains are open to allow faster exit of melting snow and fire hydrants need to be exposed. Don't forget access to the pet waste stations. And if those are full, please take your doggie bags home - - when the lid won't close due to overload, a health hazard is created and an attraction for some wild animals will exist.


