Board Update

A contract has been awarded for three eroded areas deemed to be safety issues and for a badly worn residents-made walking path. Spring tree work was completed and the irrigation systems were turned on.

Irrigation System

The stations have rain gauges and are set to turn on, when necessary, while you sleep. We had a large repair bill in the spring, partly due to damage, which was preventable.

Treat Your Neighbor as You Would Like to be Treated

Our builder complied with the County's requirements on parking (slightly more than two spaces per house). However the builder was not required to have two parking spaces near each unit.

A quick review of parking is that our documents allow for <u>one assigned space</u>. That space is for the sole use of the townhouse with that address. All the <u>unnumbered spaces</u> are on a <u>first-come first-park basis</u>. It has been noted that some owners with a single car consistently park in an unnumbered space. And there are those who move the second car into the unnumbered space when spouse goes to work. Would you like to have company and parking is unavailable because your neighbor is guilty of bad parking habits?

This is a great community. Let's all be "Good Parking Neighbors"

What is that in the Woods?

The deer population has caused major damage to our woods by eating everything green but they didn't bring in all the flower pots, cement blocks, bricks, dead plants, etc. that abound. Please don't dispose of anything in the woods! We love our beautiful Community.

We are in the midst of our 6th season with bluebird boxes and what a year it is so far! This past winter, many of the bluebird boxes were moved further from the tree-line to maximize suitability for bluebirds and to minimize the nesting of our native House Wrens (which had been monopolizing nest boxes). This small change has had a big impact – we already have our first two successful bluebird nests, one with 5 eggs and the other with 4, our first ever tree swallow nest with 6 eggs. Tennis Courts

For the sake of our dues, please remember the courts are for tennis ONLY! No food or drink inside, no children unless playing tennis (not even if they are in strollers), no skateboarding, bicycling, etc. The surface is expensive to repair when damage occurs. Children under 12 are not allowed without adult supervision.

Dogs at Tot Lots

Dogs are nice pets but when they urinate in the mulch it's smelly and unsanitary. Our kids play, throw and sit on that mulch. Please leave your dogs at home when enjoying the tot lots.

Concern for Our Children

Your dues pay to keep our Community looking good. Toward that end, please remember your children are not unbreakable. You are responsible for any damage your children cause, so be alert. Even broken off lower branches are harmful to the health of trees. Some children also pose a risk by riding skateboards and bicycles on the streets. Those children do not have the rightof-way and shouldn't be using the streets for those activities. Unless you have coordinated with another parent to assume responsibility, please don't leave your child(ren) unattended at the tot lot.

Be Aware: Report sightings of Invasive Lanternflies

A destructive and highly invasive insect, the Spotted Lanternfly (SLF), was newly reported in Virginia in January 2018 (in Frederick County/Winchester). First accidentally introduced into Pennsylvania in 2014, SLF were reported in New York and Delaware in the fall of 2017. Virginia Cooperative Extension requests residents get familiar with this insect and report any sightings to help control potential outbreaks. Fairfax ReLeaf Tree Planting Update

Over half of the 50 free trees planted in November 2017 made it through the winter. This is the expected survival rate – not bad for being planted and left to thrive on their own without additional care! The trees, supplied by Fairfax ReLeaf, will continue to have tree tubes left around them to protect them from mowers and deer browse (sometimes for several years). The HOA will work with Fairfax ReLeaf to replace necessary seedlings in the fall of 2018, when they have the best chance of survival.

Bird Nests In Your Gutters?

...or behind your outside lights? In a vent? The birds are cute, but their nests can cause damage to your home. If your drain spout (near the splash block) seems to have a continuous drip or wet spot, your gutter may be clogged, causing water to trickle down the drainpipe. If birds have nested in your vents, their next stop might be into your stove. Move the nests or have them removed before the damage gets costly.

What Should I Do With Latex Paint?

Latex paint is not considered a hazardous waste. Before disposing of it, try to find someone who can use it – such as a neighbor, theater group, or church. If you must dispose of it, pour paint onto newspaper, let the paint dry, then throw away the newspaper with your regular garbage. Mixing kitty litter into the paint accelerates drying.

What to do with "Unusable" Flags



According to Federal law, the U.S. Flag is to be disposed of when damaged, soiled or torn and no longer suitable for display.

You can dispose of yours 24/7 at the Franconia Police Department in a white bin. It will be ceremoniously disposed of by Fairfax Police Department Honor Guard members in coordination with the Fire Department.

And if you buy a replacement one soon, you can fly it on June 14 (Flag Day) or July 4 (Independence Day).

Grill Safety

The lazy days of summer can hold various fire dangers. The combination of hot, dry days and BBQs can sometimes have a lethal outcome. Awareness can help to protect both the people and land around you. Here are some grill safety tips:

- Keep grills far enough away from your home, or other combustibles, so that an adequate amount of air can circulate (15 feet).
- Charcoal must be kept dry, as wet charcoal can spontaneously ignite. Spare propane bottles should be stored outside and away from your home.
- Keep children away from the grill. Grills continue to give off heat long after the cooking has stopped.
- When finishing with your cookout, be sure to dispose grill ashes and/or charcoal in a safe fashion. NEVER place hot ashes in paper or plastic bags or containers. Only use metal containers for hot ashes.
- It's always a good idea to have a back up plan keep a fire extinguisher in your kitchen. Enjoy the summer and stay cool and safe!

Thunderstorms

Thunderstorms produce lightning and have potential for danger.

- Keep an eye on the sky. Look for darkening skies, flashes of light or increasing wind
- Listen for the sound of thunder. When it roars, go indoors and stay there until 30 minutes after the last clap of thunder
- Don't wait for the rain to start before seeking shelter

Thunderstorms can also bring flooding. Do not drive on flooded roads – "turn around don't drown." Two feet of swift water can move or float most vehicles, including SUVs and pickup trucks.
