## No Deer Hunt in Loftridge Park

Due to low harvest the last two seasons and homeowner interference, the County has decided that sharpshooting has not produced desired results and will not be conducting a deer hunt in Loftridge Park this fall.

The deer population continues to increase while the food supply doesn't. Unless bowhunting is favored by residents, there may not be any future consideration by the County.

## **Board News**

Sidewalk repairs and asphalt repaving are planned for September. Bids are being evaluated for several erosion projects. Redesigning of the entrance plantings is planned for Fall as well as planting of a few trees.

## Vehicle Safety Inspection Increase

The annual safety inspection will now cost you \$20, the first increase in thirteen years. \$.50 goes to the State Police, remaining amount to the inspecting facility. Stations were opting not to perform the inspections since more profit could be made charging for repairs. Some stations will accept those discount coupons you get in the mail.

## Virginia Tax Checks

To compensate for not generating changes to the tax rates for 2018, Virginia will be issuing checks by October 15 to all who filed 2018 returns. Single filers will receive a check for \$110, joint filers will get \$220.

## Phone in Hand = Fine!

Effective January 1, 2020 holding a phone in your hand while driving will subject you to a fine of \$125 for first offense, \$250 for any further violations.

# **Prevent Pet-Related Fires**

- Keep pets away from stoves and counter tops to prevent a pet accidentally turning on a stove knob. While you are away, you could remove the knobs or use knob covers all the time.
- Keep pets away from candles. Consider battery-operated flameless candles.
- Always use a metal or heat-tempered glass screen on a fireplace.
- Don't let pets chew through electrical cords.
- If your pet is outside, make sure their housing is located away from brush and any vegetation that could act as fuel.

## And in Case of Fire

- All pets should wear or have implanted identification in case they flee.
- Never go back inside for pets. Tell firefighters they are inside.
- Make sure pets are included in your family's fire evacuation plan. Have a "container" for quick and easy loading into a vehicle.

# Winter Preparations

To minimize damage from weight of ice, heavy snow or heavy winds, trim tree limbs that hang over your roof.

Clean out leaves and other debris from your gutters, repair any holes and look to make sure they haven't pulled away from the edge of the house. Gutter guards are a good idea to reduce leaf accumulation.

# Pedestrian Safety

October is the month with the highest pedestrian involved incidents. According to local police, it is a <u>myth</u> that "pedestrians always have the right-of-way."

Many jurisdictions have begun pedestrian safety initiatives to encourage drivers and walkers to be more aware of surroundings. No one intends to get run over!!

# Fall Landscaping Tips

<u>Plant Fall bulbs now</u> and forget about them until next Spring. Prepare bed with rich, well-drained soil. Add planting mix and work into the existing soil to a depth of 6". Place the bulb (pointed side up!) then cover with soil mix. Water well and cover with mulch.

<u>Divide those perennials</u> to control their size, rejuvenate them and increase their numbers. There is no set rule as to when to divide them, but it is best to divide spring and summer blooming perennials in the Fall and fall bloomers in the Spring. Dividing the plant when it is not flowering enables the plant to focus its energy on growing new roots and leaves.

The most used method of dividing is to dig up the whole clump and carefully separate it into several smaller clumps. It's important to use a spade with a long, narrow blade. After removing, prune dead and damaged tissue, and make sure each section has a portion of roots and leaves. Replant the divisions in pre-prepared holes at the same depth they were originally. Water the new divisions plentifully, and keep them well-watered through their first year.

<u>Tree and shrubs</u> are best planted now. Their chances of survival are better and they are often marked down at nurseries and stores.

## **Change Furnace Filter**

If you don't replace your filter as recommended, it becomes overwhelmed with dust and creates a strain on your HVAC system. This might increase your electric bill or worse, cause irreparable damage to your system.

## Alexandria Celebrating 270 Years

The Alexandria area was booming, so to facilitate shipping, in 1748 a petition was presented to the Virginia General Assembly to establish a town at West's Hunting Creek Warehouse. In 1749, that site was selected and the new town was named Alexandria in honor of the early owner of much of the land, Scotsman John Alexander. Sixty acres were laid out and lots were auctioned off that same year

## Star Spangled Banner is 205

This song was written on September 14, 1814 by Francis Scott Key as he witnessed the bombardment of Ft McHenry by the British Royal Navy in Baltimore Harbor in the War of 1812. He was inspired by the large US flag with 15 stars and 15 stripes flying triumphantly above the fort during the US victory.

It was named the National Anthem in 1931 by Congressional Resolution.

## **Distracted Walking**
