News from the Board

Bids were obtained and are being evaluated for parking space numbering and tic



marks, fire lane painting, erosion control and asphalt/concrete work. A contract was awarded to Shenandoah Landscape to replace the timber retaining wall at Cheatham and Ridge View. Spring dead tree removal was accomplished and invasive vines were cut back in two large areas. The County toured the big field on Cannon Lane in

processing our application for a money-matching grant using native plants. Mulching and Spring clean-up were done and annuals planted at entrances.

Irrigation System

Tennis Court Usage

This is a walking trail!! It is **not intended for motorized vehicles** of any kind. If you see ATVs or motorcycles on the path, report this illegal activity to the police at 703-691-3121.

The courts are designed for playing tennis. If you see any other activity inside the court, please contact the Board. Inappropriate activity damages the court's surface and costs us all when repairs are needed.

Loft Ridge's Bluebird Boxes

This spring, three additional bluebird nest boxes were installed around the tennis courts, complimenting the four already in the Cannon Lane field. While bluebirds were spotted in our community throughout the winter, none chose to nest in our boxes. However, as of May 2016, two families of Carolina Chickadee have successfully raised 5+

eggs each. As spring progresses House Wrens are beginning to build their nests and have already laid eggs in at least one box.

At the end of each season, (this is our 4th), the species and nesting successes, complete with counts of successful fledglings, are reported to the Virginia Bluebird Society to help with overall tracking of trends of native bird populations.



Continued Watershed Conservation

In 2015, Loft Ridge HOA received a grant from the Northern Virginia Soil & Water Conservation District (NVSWCD) to install a rain garden in the common area behind the homes on Gypsy Court. The garden is working wonderfully to retain roof run-off and NVSWCD has been using photos of this rain garden on their website and in their print materials as an example of a successful project.

The HOA has received a second grant from NVSWCD to plant native plants in a frequently wet area of the Cannon Lane field in the fall of 2016. These seasonably wet areas can provide habitat for amphibians if surrounded by a richer ecosystem than simply grass. This will be an exciting addition to Loft Ridge's growing native habitat restorations.

Updated Noise Ordinance

The law prohibits:

- Using a loudspeaker or amplifier between 7pm and 7am
- Making noise that can be plainly heard in another person's home with the doors and windows closed between 10pm and 7am Sunday through Thursday and between 11pm and 7am on Friday, Saturday and the day before a Federal holiday
- Barking, howling, meowing, squawking or quacking animals between 10pm and 7am when it can be heard inside a home with doors and windows closed, or if these sounds can be heard between 7am and 10pm for more than five minutes consecutively or non-consecutively within a 10 minute period.

To file a complaint:

- During daytime hours (Mon-Thurs 8am-4pm and Friday 9:15am-4pm) contact the Department of Code Compliance at 703-324-1300.
- At night, call the police non-emergency number at 703-691-2131. You don't have to give your name or address unless you want to be contacted.

Civil penalties start at \$250, rising to \$500 for subsequent offenses. Criminal convictions would be misdemeanor.

Dumping

The woods we enjoy are part of the appeal of Loft Ridge but that area wasn't meant to be a dumping ground. Water can't get to tree roots when grass clippings, yard waste, leaves, etc. are piled atop the ground. Cutting and

removing a dead or dying tree costs about \$600 of your Association dues. Unnatural items in the woods provide a habitat for raccoons, snakes, rats, etc.

Branches will be taken by the County on trash day, simply tie them in bundles or put in bags. A special bulk pick-up (i.e. fence/deck wood) can be arranged by calling 703-802-3322. Root balls, stumps, dirt, cement, etc need to be taken to the County dump.

Summer Weather



2015 summer's weather beat the previous record set in 2014. Those 11.94" of rain in June fell short of the record of 14.02" in 2006. The heat continued with 40% of the days above 90 and 50% above 80 with high humidity making it seem much warmer. That made June the 6th hottest on record. And July into August saw a string of 13 90+ days.

Accuweather is predicting 46 days over 90, far above our average of 31 days.

Summer Plant Tips

Plants have different water needs. Plants with large leaves (hydrangea, rhododendron) or with shallow root systems (azalea, dogwood) are usually the first to suffer during drought periods. Shrubs under large trees are especially susceptible because of the large volume of water taken up by tree roots. Plants are more prone to suffer from drought during their first two years especially if planted in late spring or summer due to a shorter time to establish roots.

Fertilization also affects the tolerance of plants to dry weather. Recently or heavily fertilized plants can easily suffer root damage. Severe pruning results in vigorous tender growth that is more dependent on uniform moisture. Weeds rob plants of needed moisture. And low humidity, wind, or bright, sunny days signal a call for the hose.

Dear Kids and Parents

STREETS are for CARS. **Kids** can't be seen if you dart out from between cars and cars shouldn't have to stop so you can play in their space.

Show respect when you play on the common grounds. Recently there have been toys left out, play areas constructed and trash left around. Residents care how our community looks and children learn young. **Parents** please set a good example and teach your children to clean up items from areas that aren't your private

Yard Critter Control

Squirrels won't dig plants from your yard or flowerpots if you sprinkle crushed red pepper



on top of the soil. And deer will go elsewhere if you fertilize your plants with blood meal since they don't like the smell of this organic fertilizer.

Poison Ivy

This condition is due to an allergic reaction to an oily black substance found in the leaves, stems and roots of poison ivy, poison oak or poison sumac. A mild case will clear up in a couple of weeks. If rash is widespread, on face, near eyes or genitals, you may need a prescription drug. Cool baths and showers can provide some relief. Calamine lotion also helps relieve the itching. Don't scratch the rash.

The best medicine is to avoid contact with the plants!! "Leaves of three, let it be" "hairy vines no friends of mine" and "longer middle stem, stay away from them" don't make good poetry but might be useful in helping to identify poison ivy.

Wearing long sleeves and pants and gloves while doing yard work helps. If you get exposed, wash the exposed skin with rubbing alcohol, then with cold water and finally shower with soap and water.

Thunderstorms

Thunderstorms produce lightning and have potential for danger.

- Keep an eye on the sky. Look for darkening skies, flashes of light or increasing wind
- Listen for the sound of thunder. When it roars, go indoors and stay there until 30 minutes after the last clap of thunder
- Don't wait for the rain to start before seeking shelter

Thunderstorms can also bring flooding. Do not drive on flooded roads – "turn around don't drown." Two feet of swift water can move or float most vehicles, including SUVs and pickup trucks.
