

In 2016, Fairfax County conducted surveys (by camera and in person) which quantified the number of deer in Clermont and Loftridge Parks and the impact they were having on native vegetation needed for a healthy ecosystem. Based on this data and broad support from residents in our HOA, the County will be conducting nighttime sharpshooting operations in Clermont Park this fall and winter to reduce the population of deer. Different from the archery program proposed in 2015, the sharpshooting operation is operated by the police department, done only at night when the park is closed, and will occur on no more than 4 nights between Nov. and March. All venison harvested through this program is donated to Hunters for the Hungry. More information can be found online:

Loft Ridge Wins a Litter-Free Grant - You Can Help!

Coming soon in Fall 2017: Picking up trash to help keep our community and parkland clean and safe just got easier. And you can help!

The Loft Ridge HOA applied for and won a \$750 grant from Keep Virginia Beautiful to install a cleanup station by the tennis courts. Inspired by All One Ocean's beach cleanup stations, this station has information about the impacts of trash and also provides the opportunity to put litter in its place. The box holds repurposed bags you can use to collect trash! Just grab a bag, pick up trash, report back how much trash you collected, empty the bag into the adjacent trash can, and return the bag to the cleanup station (if clean enough to re-use).

2017 Bluebird Box Wrap-Up

Our 5th season of monitoring bluebird nest boxes as part of the Virginia Bluebird Trail has come to a close. Early in the season, we added 2 final nest boxes to our trail in the field across from the Ridge View Drive tot lot, a location known to have attracted bluebirds in the past. These new boxes netted us our first successful bluebird nest since 2013 – 4 bluebird babies were raised! Across Loft Ridge's nine total boxes, the native House Wren continues to dominate the nests, with 17 total babies raised this year. Because House Wrens compete aggressively with Eastern Bluebirds for these boxes (i.e. throwing bluebird eggs out of the nest), we will be considering ways to minimize wren disturbance in 2018 to help give bluebirds the best chance for nesting success.

Loft Ridge Partners with Fairfax ReLeaf

Fairfax ReLeaf (http://www.fairfaxreleaf.org/), a non-profit organization which supplies free, native seedlings to help organizations improve their ecology, is excited for the opportunity to offer Loft Ridge trees for our common property. In our HOA's first project with them this coming fall, Fairfax ReLeaf will supply and plant 50 native trees and shrubs in the low (and often wet) area east of the tennis courts. The species have been selected to provide a wonderful array of flowers through multiple seasons (e.g. redbud, serviceberry, witchhazel) as well as food for residents and wildlife alike (e.g. hazelnut, persimmon, chickasaw plum). Residents will have to be patient, as the seedlings provided are small and will take a few years to become larger and established. We look forward to many years of enjoying this free addition to our property.

Vietnam Veterans Memorial's 35th Anniversary

This Memorial began construction in March 1982 and was formally dedicated November 13, 1982. It honors U.S. services member of the armed forces who fought in the Vietnam War, those who died in Vietnam/South East Asia and those unaccounted for (Missing in Action) during the War, totaling 58,318.

When any of the three million annual visitors looks upon the wall, his or her reflection can be seen simultaneously with the engraved names, which is meant to symbolically bring the past and present together.

Cleaning Deck Crevices

One easy method is to insert a "screw-in" hook into the end of a broom and drag the hook through the cracks. The hook will pick up the debris which can be swept into a dustpan. And it can be done standing up!!

Change Furnace Filter

If you don't replace your filter as recommended, it becomes overwhelmed with dust and creates a strain on your system. This might increase your electric bill or worse, cause irreparable damage to your system.

Smoke Detectors

You might consider a model with a battery backup for your wired-in smoke detector in case of loss of power.

Some models come with a 10-year lithium battery and are highly reliable, tamper-resistant and require little maintenance.

Fireplace Damper Safety

Keep your damper closed year-round except when using the fireplace. To help prevent heat loss, consider installing glass doors.
